I. President's Review

As my vocation is in the healthcare field, it was important to me that this year had a focus on supporting the health and wellness of our community. Through our programs and service projects, our club made this happen. While I work for a nonprofit community hospital the definition of health goes well beyond just taking care of people when they are sick. It is important that we support the physical health of our community, the mental health, the economic health, and the environmental health of the community.

To kick off the year, the Club volunteered at the California Care Force Health Clinic at Nevada Union High School. This is a weekend long health clinic that provides free dental, vision and medical care to underserved and underinsured individuals, veterans, seniors, and families in Nevada County and surrounding areas. More than 150 volunteer healthcare professionals from throughout California provided needed care for about 750 people per day. Dental and vision services proved to be the most needed. All services were free. The Club prepared and served lunch for the healthcare workers and other volunteers for the event.

To focus on the environmental health of our community we had to get our hands a little dirty. The Club supported the garden at Lyman Gilmore Middle School and funded a garden educator to work with the students in the garden. They learn about soil health and nutrients, seed germinators, pollinators, what the plants need and when to plant, and even how to take care of a little gopher problem. The garden had such an abundance of food this year that they were able to donate to the Interfaith Food Ministry. The Club also worked on a beautification project on the Litton Trail in Grass Valley off Sierra College Drive. Club members planted three trees and about one hundred daffodil bulbs. The Club continued to work on the plastic bag collection project recovering thousands of plastic bags that normally would have ended up in our landfills and waterways. This collection ended up with the Club earning a new Trex bench that was donated to the Hospital's new vegetable garden.

To support the mental health of the community, the Club focused on our youth. Youth Services is one of the most important things that we do in Rotary. These times are hard for our tweens and teens. They have been through multiple wars, economic turmoil, civil unrest, incredible political divisiveness, and an unprecedented pandemic that changed their childhood forever. Oh yes...top that with the pressures put on them by society through social media and cyberbullying. Anything that we can do that will help repair childhood trauma is essential for a healthy future. The root of most of our society's problems such as substance abuse, mental health, and homelessness all stem from some

form of childhood trauma. If we can help repair the trauma, we can break generational cycles of abuse, poverty, and addiction.

If we are going to tackle these issues locally, we need help. Our Club called upon four other Rotary Clubs in the District to come together to support the new NEO Youth Center at Bright Futures for Youth in Grass Valley. With a grant from District 5190 and utilizing all the clubs matching and bonus dollars, we received a district grant of \$24,988. In addition, our Club donated \$15,000 in memory of club member Mike Johnson. When I first became more involved with the operations of the Club, I learned about this "Mike Johnson Fund" that we had been holding on to. I remember hearing about Mike when I first joined and all he had done for Youth Services in our District. Mike was a big advocate to support local youth programs and was instrumental in bringing Rotary Youth Leadership Awards and REGL Leadership Camp to our area. I immediately knew that we could make an impact on the youth center project and do this in memory of Mike. The new Youth Center will open in October of 2023 and will have a plaque honoring the gifts from the Rotary Clubs and in memory of Mike.

This year was also special because it was the first-year post covid that we were 100% back in person at the Wild Eye Pub with all our events in full force. With the exception of some interruptions from SnowMageddon 2.0, the club was in person all year long! Casino Night is back! A Viva Las Vegas theme brought Elvis into the building, and this year we include a new Wine and Whiskey Pull that brought in new income. The Club continued the Drive Thru BBQ event with a Santa Maria BBQ spin. The Gold Country Challenge was a considerable success with the most registrations we have had to date. After having to cancel the Area 4 Rotary Foundation Dinner due to SnowMageddon 2.0, we hosted a recognition event at the Wild Eye Pub in June.

Thanks to all the Rotarians and volunteers who helped make this year meaningful and successful. As a single mom who works full-time and started a big promotion on July 1st, I must give so much credit to the club Board of Directors and committee chairs. I could have not gotten through this wild and crazy year without your dedication to Rotary and heart for service.
